2007 Master Mariners Annual Regatta

This year we had good winds to carry us around every mark and as a result there were close finishes in many of the divisions. 75 of the 80 boats that entered started the race and only four failed to cross the finish line. There were no protests, no collisions, and no dismastings but there was one unfortunate sinking. A jibe around Southhamton Shoal caused NUOVO MONDO, the small felucca, to swamp and go down. Fortunately everyone aboard was picked up safely and the boat was later raised; she will live to sail another day! Otherwise there were just the usual bumps and bruises to humans and yachts that come with competitive sailing.

Many thanks go to Jay Rigler, the Sausalito YC Race Chairman, Jeff Zarwell our U.S. Sailing Race Official and the crew of the *Mercury* from Sausalito YC who helped us record the starts and finishes. Special thanks go to Dick Wrenn and Chris Newell, both MMBA members, who were on the committee boat and helped identify the many vessels and tabulate the race results. There were many other members that volunteered their time and efforts to ensure we had another great regatta and my sincere thanks go out to them.

We had twelve divisions this year. Eight Bear Boats, up from six the year before, went out as a fleet with ALMA at noon. The Bears started a come back last year and we hope to see ten out there next year. Six Bird Boats entered the race ensuring they had their own division. Unfortunately one started taking on water at the dock and could not start – there's always next year. The four L-36s started together as a non-spinnaker division to make for more evenhanded competition. There were four Marconi and three Gaff divisions along with the Ocean Class and Big Schooner. The Marconi IV yacht KAERESTA was the first Folkboat to have raced in the Regatta and we had the good fortune to have LYNX the magnificent topsail schooner in the race and we hope to see her again next year. I counted 19 new members entered in the race and many did quite well; congratulations and welcome.



First place winners collected their strutting cock flags and were given magnum bottles of Cabernet Sauvignon donated by Ted



Your interest and commitment to participate in this year's show, is greatly appreciated. This event is MMBA's only fundraiser and we hope to raise enough money for our Master Mariners Benevolent Foundation (MMBF) to continue funding our MMBA scholarships.

The CYC shore boat will meet you outside the CYC harbor after 1400 to provide you with your slip assignment. Monitor channel 68 VHF to communicate with Han's or Craig. A drawing of the YC harbor is enclosed for your information. You will receive your berthing assignment on arrival.
